### Up Next: Fun with Dragon Boats (& Dinner)

Come try dragon boating, a true TEAM sport! Imagine a group of people working in tandem toward a common goal. Throw in a dash of competitiveness, a big helping of fun and a few splashes of water - it's a great combo.

No experience or equipment required. Paddles and life jackets will be provided. Wear exercise clothes that can get a bit wet. Bring a hat, sunglasses, other things that you may want to have based on that day's weather.

Family and friends are encouraged to attend. Children must be 15 years or older in order to participate in the dragon boating.

Jeff Campbell has been involved in dragon boat racing for more than 20 years. As the owner-operator of Double Fifth, he and his office dog Star run the show. The dog is responsible for sleeping under the desk and Jeff handles everything else. His philosophy is simple: Take care of your customers and they will take care of you. This means a satisfied paddler is always his goal. It's about making sure the paddler gets everything they need, even if it means sending them to another store. He's your friend in the paddling industry.
