

**THE ROTARY DISTRICT 6360 FOSTERING YOUTH LEADERSHIP & SERVICE (FYLS) FOUNDATION provides Grants to  
Rotary groups within District 6360 for youth-related Rotary projects.  
Grant Policy, Guidelines and Application**

The overall intent of the fund is to support group efforts, though not excluding individual requests. For example (but not limited to), FYLS could offer matching funds to:

- an Interact Club to fund a trip (up to a maximum amount) to the Dominican Republic to help install BioSand Filters
- pay for lunch for the Youth Exchange students to attend the District Conference
- help pay for RYLA students to attend their Advanced Session at PETS
- help pay for Rotaract president elects to attend District 6360 training programs
- support youth activities which encourage youth to go/do different places and things

The FYLS Fund shall be held and administered by the District 6360 Foundation and contributions to it will be tax deductible to the extent allowed by law.

In recognition of "Service Above Self" for over a decade to Rotary District 6360, a fund is being proposed to recognize Linda and Ed Foster. At the Foster's request, this fund is to help support Rotary approved projects involving its youth programs and shall be called, "Fostering Youth Leadership & Service" (FYLS). The fund is intended to be an on-going entity as long as funds are available.

The deadline for grants for FYLS Grants is December 1<sup>st</sup> each year. A group may apply for one grant per year.

Grants will be voted upon by the board, in consultation with Ed and Linda Foster, at the December meeting and announced January 1<sup>st</sup>.

The Foundation prefers to fund matching grant applications from \$250 - \$2500, up to a total of \$7200 this year.

Grant funds are to be expended only for the purpose for which they were intended. Unused funds will remain in the Rotary District 6360 FYLS Foundation Fund.

Grant applications from Rotary Clubs with outstanding Final Reports from previous grants will not be considered.

On a separate sheet of paper, briefly describe your project. Description must be typed or computer generated and should be no longer than one page. Include:

- 35-word or less summarized description of the project.
- A description of how the project fulfills an unmet need for youth leadership and/or service opportunities.
- Whether this is a new program.
- Whether this is to be a continuing project. If so, explain how it will continue to be funded.
- What do you intend to do with the funds?
- Whether your request is for matching funds, or seed money.
- How many individuals will be involved in this project?
- What Rotary Club will be involved and in what way?
- How will you publicize this project and being the recipient of the grant?
