### PROGRAM:

Chloe Hough from the Live Well Center at



Westminster explained a new exercise program called “Rock Steady Boxing” that helps people adapting to life with Parkinson’s disease. This illness affects one out of every 100 citizens age 60 and older. There is no known cause or cure for the disease. It affects an

equal number of men and women. Participating in Rock Steady Boxing is a way to fight back against Parkinson’s. This is an unusual type of boxing – boxing without blood! The four main symptoms of Parkinson’s are: tremor; slowness of movement; rigidity of arms, legs, trunk; and trouble with balance. The disease also causes freezing and shuffling. The Rock Steady Boxing program was created by Scott

Newman in 2006. It is headquartered in Indianapolis and there are 500 locations worldwide. Boxing targets symptoms such as speed of movement; gait; posture and fine motor skills. It prevents the acceleration of the disease. There are 48 boxers at Westminster in three different levels of classes. The classes each meet three times per week for an hour. A key ingredient of each class is *FUN*. Even though participants work hard during the sessions, it is important that they enjoy themselves in the process.
