## MSU P-20 Program: 'Cradle to Grave' Concept

January 11, 2017



**Speaker: Dr. Randall Wilson**, Program Coordinator for Murray State University's P-20 Program. Wilson was introduced by Rotarian Donald Shively.

**Topic: Overview of MSU's P-20 Doctorate Program**

**Top Ten Takeaways for Rotarians:**

-Murray State's P-20 Program is patterned as an extension of the traditional P-16 Program which helped promote education attainment up through undergraduate degrees.

-The P-20 Mission is to "develop innovative P-20 leaders who leverage all available P-12, postsecondary and community resources to create educational and economic opportunities for their regions." The program Philosophy "purposefully spans the boundaries of pk-12, postsecondary and community agencies. It also provides a distinctive and timely approach to changing and complex educational and community environments.

-Wilson says the P-20 program's goal is to "effect change within the economy" of the region. The approach, he said, is to help develop community leaders who will set policy that, ultimately, improves the regional economy.

-In addition to the Doctoral programs, P-20 helps coordinate partnerships between local schools and the public/private sectors. He cited various examples such as local companies utilizing high school students for on-the-job training, and, the Paducah Police Department's Cultural Leadership Program.

-Wilson said the program includes an entrepreneurial focus that teaches leaders how to answer the need for additional funding in the wake of decreased state funding for educational programs.

-The P-20 Doctoral Program is a 60-hour program taking approximately three years to complete. The program accepts 25 new students per year, and is designed as a cohort group (same students go through the entire program together as a group). Class meetings are held one weekend per month during the academic year.

-The P-20 program specialization areas include: STEM Specialization; pK-12 Specialization; Postsecondary Specialization; and, Agricultural Education Specialization.

-The program is graduating its first group of students this year.

-Applications are currently being accepted for the 2017 P-20 program.
