A Unique Perspective on the Middle East

Dr. Scott Garrett, is a rare individual among academics. Not only is he a scholar of history, but a boots on the ground kind of guy as a soldier in the U.S. Army and the Reserves. Those qualifications netted him an appointment as a Sergeant Major of Military History, which reported to the Joint Chiefs of Staff for present and future operations.

The assignment led him to multiple tours in the Middle East during which he had "blanket orders," meaning everything he wished to do was authorized. His knowledge of Islamic history combined with his personal experiences was

instrumental to the success of military operations in a troubled arena.

"There are 1.3 billion Muslims in the world and most would not want to harm you because you are Christian," he said. The radical factions that would are about 1,200 years behind modern times, which adds to the complexity of the situation in the Middle East. "There are more different kinds of Muslims than there are Christians and they often don't like each," said Garrett.

He said the fundamentalist Muslims wish to return the world to a Caliphate where a descendant of the Prophet Muhammad would rule both the spiritual world and all governments. Dr. Garrett said the media often ignores the role organized crime plays in the unrest. He recounted how a man accepted \$50 from a terrorist faction to simply fire an RPG at American troops. These criminals are also responsible for kidnappings where the victims may change hands a number of times to the highest bidder.

He is also concerned about the recent nuclear agreement with Iran "There cannot be stability in the region if Iran is allowed to develop nuclear weapons. Iran has been a sponsor of state terrorism for twenty years," said Dr. Garrett. The difference between the U.S. and Soviet Cold War and a nuclear threat in the Middle East is the radical Muslims believe they will achieve "paradise" in a mutually assured destruction scenario. "The best world is yet to come," he said in the minds of terrorists.

When questioned on why moderate Muslims don't oppose the radical factions he said many are afraid of reprisals, which is comparable to the penalties of death meted out a thousand years ago for those disagreed with the Catholic Church. "Muslims have yet to undergo the Renaissance or the Reformation," he said. The U.S. government was very particular in separating Church and State. The Islamist fundamentalists wish to apply Sharia Law to all.
