Advice from Hall of Fame Coaches

May 30, 2018



-Speakers: Joe Hosman, Illinois High School Hall of Fame Basketball Coach from Metropolis, Illinois, and, Billy Chumbler, Kentucky High School Hall of Fame Basketball Coach. Coaches Hosman and Chumbler were introduced by Rotarian Zach Hosman.

-Takeaways for Rotarians:

-Coach Hosman, father of Rotarian Zach Hosman, has a total of 711 career wins at Illinois High Schools and is still actively coaching at Massac County High School. Coach Chumbler has 780 career wins at his coaching stints in Illinois and Kentucky.

-Coach Hosman shared one of his early lessons in integrity and leadership was an observation of a former coach and mentor. "You can tell a man's integrity by the way he treats his wife," Hosman said.

-Volunteer speakers are brought in each year by Coach Hosman to speak to his players about life after high school athletics. "Approximately 90% of all high school athletes end their sports careers after high school," Hosman said, "they have to learn life lessons, as well." Hosman said he and his staff work to instill the virtues of hard work, honesty, integrity, and passion for what they do.



-Coach Chumbler shared stories of taking over the Cairo, Illinois basketball program during the city's period of very public racial turmoil. He said it took over two years for the school to attract anyone to play at Cairo's gym for home games. As his teams attended tournaments all around Illinois and played well, or beat, schools with much larger enrollments, Cairo became a notable team in the state. Chumbler implemented dress, grooming, and conduct rules for his players in an effort to teach them integrity and responsibility.
