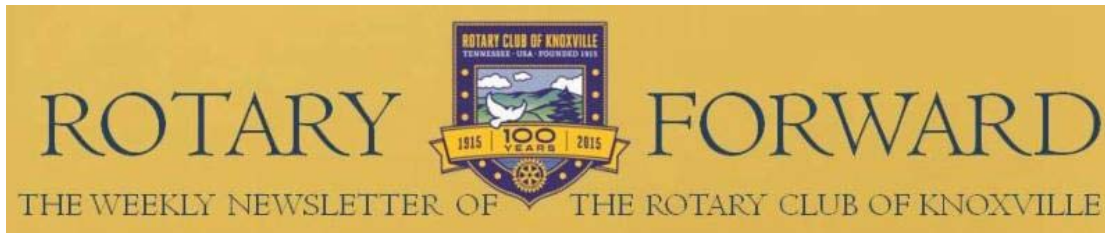

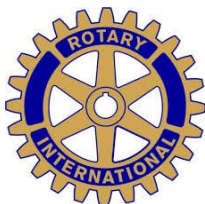

Program Recap - April 5, 2016



Cassius Cash, Superintendent of Great Smoky Mountain National Park

Superintendent Cash started off his speech to the Rotary club, thanking us for our donation of time and money to the refurbishment of the Elkmont project. The Rotary Club has a long history with the park, especially considering that the park was created by Rotary members, Mr. and Mrs. Davis when Mrs. Davis

asked one simple question during a vacation out West: "Why can't we have a national park in the East?"

One question can lead to amazing results. The question today around National Parks is: "How can we engage youth in our park system?" This is vital because the growth and stability of our parks economically and culturally hinges upon generational support. The parks affect our natural resources in air quality and water quality. They affect our health. They affect our attitude towards our history and culture.

Programs designed to bring youth to the park include leadership programs, hiking programs and much more. But it is our shared responsibility as a community to inspire youth to treasure our parks. With an average age of the 10.7 million visitors to the Great Smoky Mountains last year being 41, it becomes even more evident that teaching teenagers that our parks are a resource become the goal of today.

Weekly Polio Update

Polio Headlines:

The third Outbreak Response Assessment in Madagascar found that the surveillance system is not yet strong enough to conclude that polio transmission has been interrupted. Thirty-nine high-risk districts have been identified to receive focused attention.



There is one week to go until the [globally synchronized switch](#) from the trivalent to bivalent oral polio vaccine. Learn more about the switch through this [series of videos](#).

***Afghanistan:* No new cases of wild poliovirus 1 (WPV1) were reported in the past week.** The more recent occurred in Nawzad district of Hilmand province, with onset of paralysis on 23 January. The total number of WPV1 cases for 2016 remains 2, compared to 1 reported for 2015 at this point last year.

***Pakistan:* No new cases of wild poliovirus 1 (WPV1) were reported in the past week.** The last was recorded in Skirkarpur district of Sindh province, with onset of paralysis on 5 March. The total number The total number of WPV1 cases for 2016 remains 6, compared to 20 reported for 2015 at this point last year.

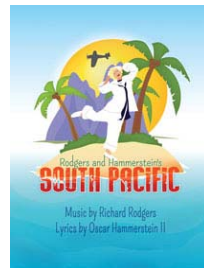
