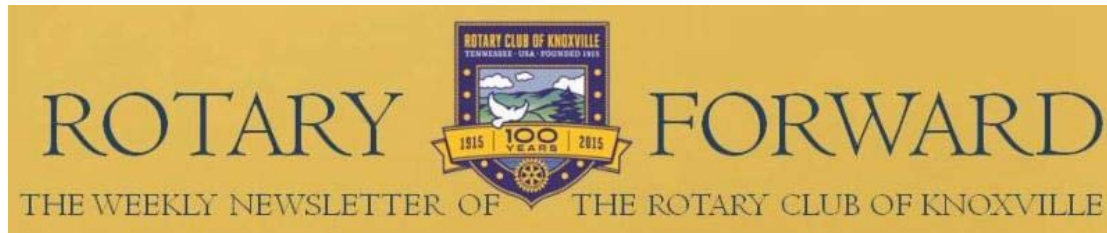

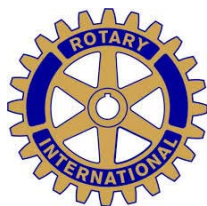

**Elaine Streno, Executive Director
Second Harvest Food Bank**

A graduate of Trevecca Nazarene University in Nashville, Tennessee, Elaine holds a degree in Social Work with a minor in business. During two tenures as Director of Second Harvest - for one year in 1985, when it was SHARE Food Bank, and then continuously since November of 1993 -- Second Harvest Food Bank of East Tennessee has grown from distributing 3.1 Million pounds of food to distributing 18 Million pounds of food through 505 partner agencies and schools. Under Elaine's management, Second Harvest has become a strong nonprofit in East Tennessee, expanding the programs from the initial rescue of leftover food to currently six programs providing 1.1 million meals a month in an 18 county service area.

Elaine has held leadership roles in many community and service organizations. In May of 2002, she was voted East Tennessean of the Year by Radio Station B97.5 for her work on behalf of the needy in the Knoxville community. She was the President of the South Knoxville Rotary in 2004-2005, and is a graduate of the 2004 Leadership Knoxville class and the 2013 Leadership Blount class. In 2011, Second Harvest was awarded the Local Community Service Award by PBS-East Tennessee and Home Federal in the "Be More Awards," thanks to Elaine's impassioned leadership. Elaine also was recognized by the Knoxville Area YWCA Tribute to Women in both 2011 and in 2013 as one of the top 30 women community leaders.

She describes herself as a teacher, a storyteller and writer, and having the most rewarding career imaginable. Many of her clients are referred to her through hospice programs (though not all), and are in the last few months of their lives. "These people are so full of life for all that they are dying," said Judith to the group. What do they want to tell her about? Not about their past jobs or possessions. The main topic is love: how they hope their families remember them with love and know that they are loved in return.

Legacy Letters can be written to individuals such as grandchildren, but many are general letters to the whole family as a way to offer gratitude, forgiveness, and, of course, love to those left behind. Judith spends much of her time listening, and the end results are beautiful love letters to future generations.

Afghanistan: No new cases of wild poliovirus 1 (WPV1) were reported in the past week. The last case was reported in the Shagil Wa Sheltan in Kunar province, with the onset of paralysis on 1 February. The total number of WPV1 cases for 2016 remains 1, compared to 1 reported for 2015 at this point last year.

Pakistan: One new case of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) was reported in the past week, in Jacobabad district, Sindh province, with onset of paralysis on 16 February. The total number of WPV1 cases for 2016 remains 6, compared to 19 reported for 2015 at this point last year.

At 0.4 miles from Little River Road, turn right onto Little Greenbrier Road. The parking area for the Little Brier Gap Trailhead is less than a half-mile up the narrow gravel road, and is next to the historic Little Greenbrier School.
