- In June 2017 the Rotary International Convention will take place in Atlanta. Thousands of Rotarians from all over the world will travel to attend the convention. We seldom get an opportunity to attend this exciting event right in our own backyard, and I strongly encourage everyone in our district to try to attend. To make it even easier to attend we are planning to charter buses to Atlanta for the convention.

Registration will open on May 28. **If you register before December 15, 2016, you can attend the entire convention for just \$340.** The registration will go up to \$490 as we get closer to June 10-14, 2017. You can register through the DACdb Calender.

## Rotary Fellowships

Did you ever wonder how to connect with other Rotarians around the world who share your interest in a hobby or profession? Rotary fellowships are groups of Rotarians, Rotarian spouses, and Rotaractors who join together to

- share a common interest in worthwhile recreational activities (sports, hobbies, etc.);
- further their vocational development through acquaintance with others of the same profession;
- make new friends around the world;
- explore new opportunities for service; or
- have fun and enhance their experience in Rotary.

flying, or canoeing, but there are many others.

Each fellowship is operated independently of Rotary International, with its own rules, dues requirements, and administrative structure, and each fellowship elects at least three officers to oversee the group's administration.

Fellowships are expected to facilitate communication among their members and maintain regular communication with RI. Membership in fellowships is open to Rotarians, their spouses, and Rotaractors. Fellowships must be international in nature with active members in at least three countries.

Some of the benefits of being in a Rotary Fellowship are opportunities to form lasting friendships outside of the home club, district, or country and contribute to the advancement of world understanding and peace.
