### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

University of Tennessee Sports Programs

### Joan Cronan



According to Joan Cronan, "Life is about dreams and about goals." The University of Tennessee women's athletic director emeritus was informative and inspiring in her talk to our club last week. She said that she grew up a tomboy in Louisiana before it was cool to be a girl in sports. She tried to play Little League baseball when she was 12, but wasn't allowed to. She was allowed to be the team manager, but not to be a player. Cronan was glad to note that times have changed and cited Mo'ne Davis, the 13-year-old girl from Philadelphia who was the first girl to throw a shutout in the 2014 Little League World Series. She added that UT said yes to women in sports before it was cool, and she is glad to have been a part of making the change possible.

Describing herself as "a Cajun with orange blood," Cronan went on to discuss

the sports programs at UT, both men's and women's. She is excited about Butch Jones and the work he has done with the football team, and also about Holly Warlick and Lady Vols Basketball. She said that Warlick carried the torch that Pat Summit lit, but she gave Summit the credit.

Cronan reported that Pat Summit is a woman of integrity and is doing better than the last two years she was at UT. Cronan now spends about half of her time with the Alzheimer's Foundation, noting that it is the number one feared disease among people over 20 and is the number three killer in the United States. And, she is proudest of Tyler!

Following her talk Cronan answered numerous questions from club members. She said that Rotary is her favorite service organization, noting that her father was a member.

## Kroger Community Rewards Program

To use the Kroger Community Rewards Program, you should register online at [www.krogercommunityrewards.com](http://www.krogercommunityrewards.com).

- Be sure to have your Kroger Plus card handy and register your card with your organization (**Oak Ridge Rotary Sunset Community Fund**) after you sign up.
- If you do not have a Kroger Plus card, you can get one at the customer service desk in the store.
- Click on **Sign In/Register**.
- Most participants are new online customers, so they must click on **SIGN UP TODAY** in the **'New Customers'** box.
- Sign up for a Kroger Rewards Account: enter your zip code, click on **Favorite Store**, enter your email address and create a password, and agree to the terms and conditions.
- You will then get a message to check your email and click on the link within the body of the email.
- Click on **My Account** and use your email address and password to proceed to the next step.
- Click on **Edit Kroger Community Rewards** information and input your Kroger Plus card number.
- Update or confirm your information.
- Enter NPO number (**65746**) or name of the organization, select organization from list and click on **Confirm**.
- To verify that you are enrolled correctly, you will see your organization's name on the right side of your information page.
- REMEMBER, purchases will not count for our club until after you register your card.
- To use your phone number to register, call 800-576-4377 and select option 4 to get your Kroger Plus card number.
- You must swipe your registered Kroger Plus card or use the phone number that is related to your registered Kroger Plus card when shopping for each purchase to count.
