Last Week's Program

David Stanley, MD



Advanced Wound Center

Our own Dr. David Stanley presented the program at last week's meeting. He is the Medical Director of the Advanced Wound Center at MMC. He is board certified in surgery, with added qualifications in general vascular surgery, vascular medicine; certificate in primary training in hyperbaric medicine and has advanced wound care training.

The wound center has three hyperbaric chambers used to treat non-healing wounds with hyperbaric oxygen therapy. The chambers supply pure oxygen under pressure - three times normal air pressure. This allows more oxygen in the blood, which carries the oxygen throughout the body. The increased oxygen helps fight bacteria and stimulates the release of substances called growth factors and stem cells, which promote healing.

According to Dr. Stanley, the treatment actually causes new blood vessels to develop.

The hyperbaric oxygen therapy is used to treat diabetic foot ulcers, pressure, venous stasis, arterial, and vasculitic ulcers, non-healing surgical wounds, complex soft tissue wounds, traumatic or infected wounds.



Rotary Information

The Organization of Rotary

Rotary is essentially a grassroots organization, with most of its service efforts being carried out at the club level. The district and international structure is designed to support the clubs and help them provide more service in their local communities and abroad.

Clubs. Rotarians are members of Rotary clubs, which belong to the global association Rotary International (RI). Each club elects its own officers and enjoys considerable autonomy within the framework of Rotary's constitution and by-laws.

Districts. Clubs are grouped into 534 RI districts, each led by a district governor, who is an officer of RI. We are in District 6780, which includes all of Tennessee east of Nashville. The district administration, including assistant governors and various committees, guides and supports the clubs. The 2015-16 district governor is Beth Stubbs (Maryville-Alcoa Club), and the 2016-17 district governor will be Fred Heitman (RC of Oak Ridge).

Zones. The 534 RI districts are divided into 34 zones. District 6780 is in Zone 30.

RI Board. The 19-member RI Board of Directors, which includes the RI president and president-elect, meets quarterly to establish policies. Traditionally, the RI president, who is elected annually, develops a theme and emphasis for the year. In 2016-17 RI president will be **John Germ** (Chattanooga Club), and his theme will be "Rotary Serving Humanity."

Karen Wentz (Maryville-Alcoa Club) is a member of the RI Board.

The Secretariat. Rotary International is head-quartered in the Chicago suburb of Evanston, Illinois, USA, with seven international offices in Argentina, Australia, Brazil, India, Japan, Korea, and Switzerland. The office for RI in Great Britain and Ireland (RIBI), located in England, serves clubs and districts in that region. The Secretariat's
