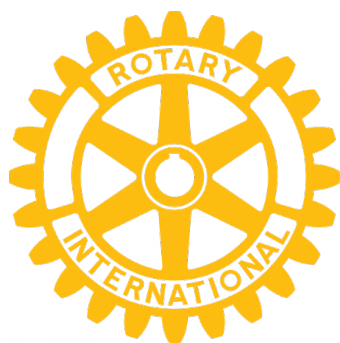

The Da Vinci Arts & Science Fair for middle school students (grades 6-8) is coming up this month - January 30. Offering this additional fair provides an avenue through which area students may progress to another level of competition in the Southern Appalachian Science and Engineering Fair (SASEF).

All members of our club are expected to help with the fair. An assignment sheet will be passed out at the January 11 meeting. The fair for grades 3-5 will be held in May as it was last year.

The SASEF is the premier science and engineering competition for students in middle and high school in the 23-county service area of East Tennessee. It has promoted teaching the scientific method in science, engineering and math since 1952. Sponsored by the University of Tennessee and many local companies and agencies, SASEF is held at the UT Thompson Boling Arena during the first week of April. There are two divisions of competition -- Junior Division for middle school students, grades 6 - 8, and Senior Division for high school students, grades 9 - 12. SASEF is an official, affiliated regional fair of the [International Science and Engineering Fair](#).

Facts about Rotary Scholarships

The Rotary Foundation has a rich history of funding scholarships for undergraduate and graduate study in a wide range of academic fields. Clubs and district can create their own scholarships and fund them with district grants for any level of studies or with global grants for graduate studies in an area of focus.

District Grant Scholarships

District grants can be used to sponsor secondary school, undergraduate and graduate students studying any subject, either locally or abroad. In addition, the scholarship may cover any length of time - from a six-week language training program to a year or more of university study. Districts may ask scholars to make presentations to local Rotary clubs and participate in Rotary service projects, but such involvement is not required.

Global Grant Scholarships

Global grants support scholarships for graduate students studying abroad in one of the six Rotary areas of focus. Scholarships range from one to four years and, therefore, can include an entire degree program. Prospective scholars must show proof of admission to the chosen university before the grant will be approved. Global grant scholars are expected to participate in club or district activities before, during, and after the scholarship.
