Backyard Beekeepers - Lilburn, GA

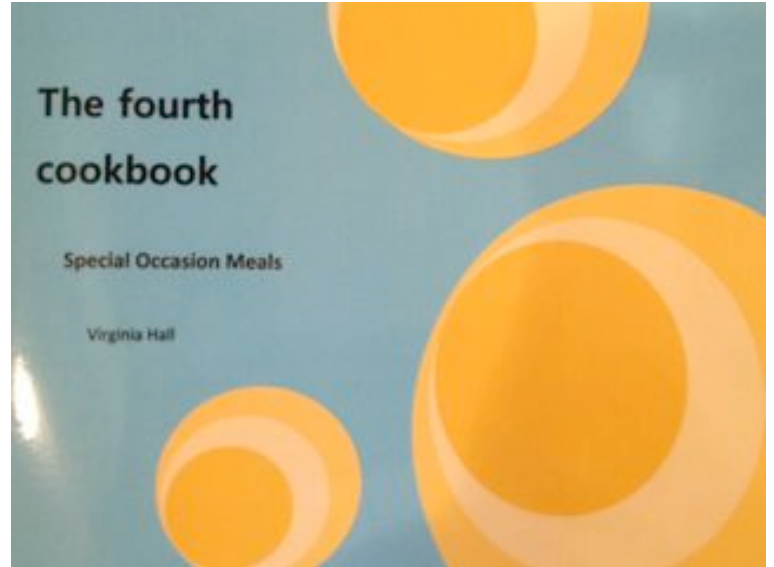
