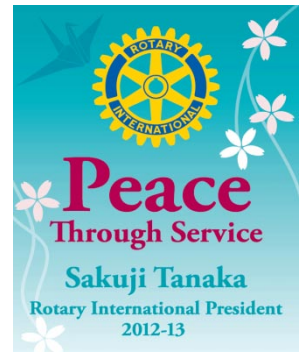

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL (RI) NEWS: Rotary International has designated certain months of the year as times for Rotary clubs to emphasize the involvement of all Rotarians in designated activities. Clubs are encouraged to plan special programs on the appropriate topics during these months. **November is designated as Foundation Month**, a time to highlight our commitment to the important work accomplished by The Rotary Foundation.

ROTARY DISTRICT 6930 NEWS: *By the numbers:* District 6930 stretches from Titusville in the north to Boca Raton in the south. We cover six counties (Brevard, Indian River, Okeechobee, St. Lucie, Martin and Palm Beach). There are 48 clubs in our District, of which 21 are located in Palm Beach County. In our immediate area, besides our breakfast club, there is the Palm Beach club (meets Thursdays at The Breakers at 12:15) and the West Palm Beach club (meets Tuesdays at The Kravis Center at Noon).

A SUPER BUSY OCTOBER!

We started the month off (October 4th) by volunteering to be a part of the National Read For The Record campaign. This country-wide event is coordinated locally by the Palm Beach County Literacy Coalition. This year, several of our members read to pre-school children at Opportunity, Inc. Our volunteers have enjoyed reading to children so much that we are now expanding this activity to include quarterly community service projects. Michelle Jacobson and Lisa Kline Goldstein are coordinating our literacy projects.

October 9th brought us our first Quantum House ‘Chef For A Day’ event. This year, Bobbie Dougherty is coordinating this project, which will also be held quarterly. Children and families were treated to a mixed green salad, pot roast, scalloped potatoes, boiled carrots, and two different styles of cheese cake, home made by our own President-Elect, Ozzie Osborne.

All of that volunteerism can bring on a hearty appetite. Fortunately, on October 11th, thanks to the efforts of Charles Contessa, over 50 members and guests enjoyed what has become an annual late-Summer event: Lobster Nite at the Palm Beach Yacht Club. We first gathered in the Commodore’s Room for cocktails, hors d’oeuvres and conviviality, followed by a three course lobster dinner.

Lastly, the end of October brought our first Service Above Self Award of the 2012-13 school year at Palm Beach Day Academy. Outreach coordinator and 5th grade teacher Cynthia Kanai presented this award to 8th grade student, Julia Nye. The Service Above Self Award is presented to one student that excels in community service and leadership. Julia has volunteered 12 service hours since the beginning of this school year. In addition, over the Summer, she volunteered 94 hours at a camp called Miami Fitness Connection where she supervised and mentored children. She said her life had been changed by the trust that the camp parents had placed in her.
