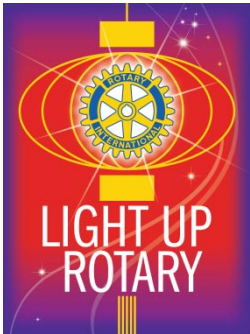

Cynthia Kanai, Community Service Director for PBDA, recognized Will at the weekly school assembly. “Will has adopted Quantum House as one of his regular community service projects. Although he enjoys the cooking, he is ready to do any chore that needs to be done. Will has vacuumed, worked in the garden, cleaned the windows...whatever was requested of him, all in great humor!”

Last year, our Foundation awarded over \$7000.00 in **local** charitable grants to several not-for-profit organizations serving literacy; healthcare; homelessness and hunger; and youth. This is what we are all about. The more we make, the more we can give.

The ‘Service Above Self’ Award is presented to one student who has excelled in community service and leadership. In order to qualify for the SASA, students must submit an essay to Mrs. Kanai summarizing what they have completed in the way of community service and/or what leadership actions they have taken that embody the ideals of Rotary’s 4-Way Test. A panel of teachers then evaluates these essays and selects one recipient for the monthly award.

Just think: If 50 people show up, we make at least \$1000.00. If 100 people show up, we make at least \$2000.00. If 1000 people show up...are you kidding?...1000 people are not going to show up!...but, you get the idea.

Our next presentation will be on Friday, December 5th, and all Rotarians are invited (and encouraged) to attend. The work that we are doing jointly with PBDA, together with the many, many other community service projects spearheaded by Mrs. Kanai, are what will help develop our Rotarians of the future.

This is also a GREAT way to introduce your friends to Rotary and hopefully attract new members to our Club. After all, we *are* the most funnest Club in the District with the best Sergeant-at-Arms!
