Quantum House Chef for a Day

On August 30th, our Club participated in its first service project at Quantum House. Quantum House is located on the campus of St. Mary's and The Nicklaus Children's Hospital. Quantum House is a ten-bedroom facility that provides a warm comfortable "home away from home" during a time of family crisis. Whether a child faces cancer treatments, a premature birth, chronic illness (such as limb lengthening or bone deformity correction) or serious accident, families learn to call Quantum House home. Most of the families that reside there are visitors from all over the country and the world. They are displaced from their homes and other family members for up to six months. One of the important goals of Quantum House is for these families to feel welcome every day and to stay focused on their child's recovery.

One of the ways that volunteers assist these families is by participating in the Chef for a Day Program. Most of these families spend all day at St. Mary's while their children are either undergoing surgery, are in recovery, or are in rehabilitation. As you can imagine, they come home hungry and tired. Chef for a Day volunteers prepare dinner for these families so as to make their life a little easier. It also affords both the families and the volunteers an opportunity to interact with one another and make new friends.

Thanks to Dusty Gebhard (with fiancée Connor MacBeth), Steve Miller, Yu Ling Cui, and Lee Gordon for volunteering. Special thanks to Robi Jurney and Caroline Eaton for helping to coordinate the evening. Extra special thanks to chef Gabrielle Steele for planning our menu (roisserie chicken, macaroni and cheese, salad, vegetable, fruit and dessert). We served approximately 30 persons that evening. **We had so much fun that we are starting this as a regular monthly service project for club members, as of Tuesday, November 2nd.**

Member Profile – Zin: Who is this mysterious new member who goes only by “Zin”???

He applied for, and received, a direct commission in the U.S. Navy, retiring as Assistant Chief of Staff for Readiness and Recruiting (Readiness Command 22). Zin moved to Florida in 2001...just a few days prior to 9/11. He is now happily reunited with his youngest daughter, Adele Zin, after a 23 year separation.
