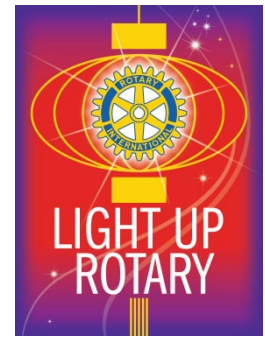

Rotary International (RI) News: Rotary International has designated certain days and months of the year as times for Rotary clubs to emphasize the involvement of all Rotarians in designated activities. Clubs are encouraged to plan special programs on the appropriate topics during these months. **October is designated as Vocational Service Month**, a time to highlight Rotary’s contribution to the second Avenue of Service. In addition, **the week of October 28th is observed as World Interact Week**. Interact is Rotary International’s service club for young people ages 12-18. There are over 10,000 Interact clubs in 118 countries. Interact clubs are sponsored by individual Rotary clubs, which provide support and guidance, but Interact clubs are self-governing and self-supporting.

October is Vocational Service Month
What, exactly, IS Vocational Service???

Throughout Rotary’s history, several basic principles have been developed to guide Rotarians in achieving the ideal of service and high ethical standards. The ‘Object of Rotary’ was formulated in 1910 and provides a succinct definition of the organization’s purpose as well as each club member’s responsibilities. The Second Object of Rotary states:

Second: High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian’s occupation as an opportunity to serve society.

As a Rotarian, how do we put this second Object of Rotary into action? Here are some suggestions:

1. Talk about your vocation in your club and take time to learn about fellow members’ vocations;
2. Use your professional skills to serve the community;
3. Practice your profession with integrity. Inspire others to behave ethically through your own words and actions;
4. Help a young person achieve his or her career aspirations. Offer to have a student or young adult “shadow” you for a day or intern for you;
5. Help guide other adults in their professional development; and
6. Teach every non-Rotarian, young and old, about the Four-Way Test.
