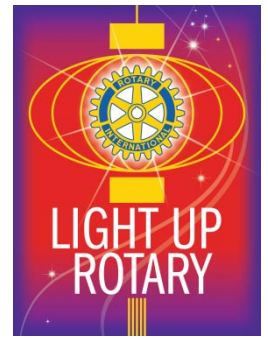

Clubs are encouraged to plan special programs on the appropriate topics during these months. **September is designated as New Generations Month**, a time to highlight Rotary's commitment to youth.

September is Rotary "New Generations Month"

New Generations refers to the youngest generation in the family of Rotary. Many are participants in Rotary's youth and young adult programs: Interact, Rotaract, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), and Rotary Youth Exchange. Others are service-minded young people involved in Rotary club and district activities.

Past RI President Luis Vicente Giay coined the term *New Generations* when he shared his belief that the future of Rotary relied on involving young people in the organization's programs and activities. At the 1996 RI Convention in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, he said: "Our vision for the future, now more than ever, is the difference between success and failure. The New Generations are our investment in the future. Let us begin to build that future today."

New Generations Service became Rotary's fifth Avenue of Service in 2010. It is defined in article 5 of the Standard Rotary Club Constitution:

New Generations Service recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities, involvement in community and international service projects, and exchange programs that enrich and foster world peace and cultural understanding.

All Rotary clubs should be committed to involving youth and young adults in their vocational, community, and international service projects, and to providing programs and resources that support them.

New Generations (continued)

Reaching out to New Generations is a commitment to the future of our Rotary club. Clubs that build ties with youth in their communities cultivate future members and become rejuvenated by the energy and new perspectives that young people have to offer. We should strive to share Rotary's ideal of service through vocational and community service projects that target youth, such as career days and mentoring programs.

We currently have several Club-level projects that support New Generations while promoting Rotary and its ideals to youth in our community:

- Recognizing students who exemplify Rotary's ideals of service by presenting 'Service Above Self' awards to deserving young students at Palm Beach Day Academy;
- Supporting youth through community service projects such as donating books to school libraries and donating dictionaries and thesauruses through our annual Dictionary Project; and
- Sponsoring one RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards) student each year.
