has a 1-3-5-10 year plan.

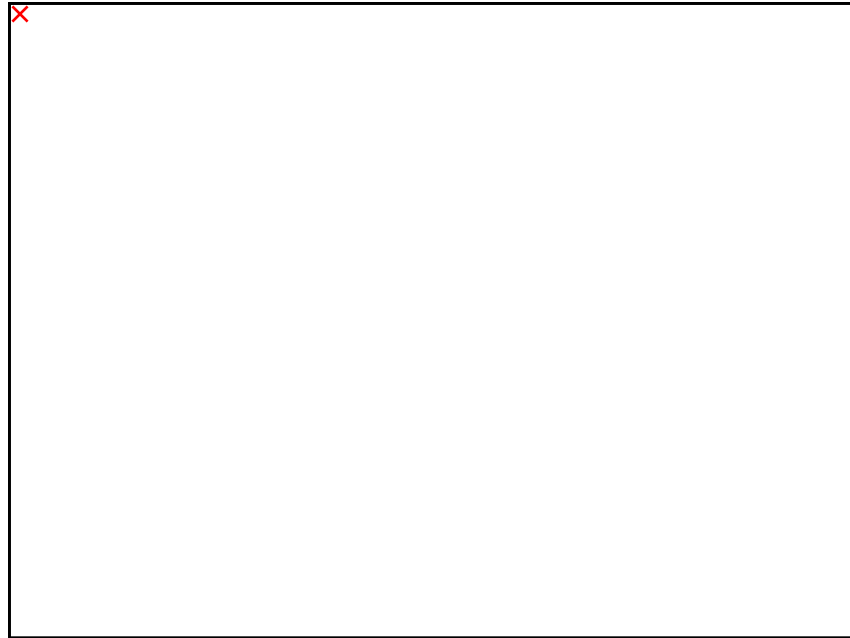
