The Object of Rotary

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and in particular, to encourage and foster:

- First...**The development of acquaintanceship as an opportunity of service;
- Second...**High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- Third...**The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life; and
- Fourth...**The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Four-Way Test

The following 24-word test created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers. It was adopted by Rotary in 1943.

“Of the things we think, say or do:

1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?”

SERVICE

Five Avenues of Service

Based on the Object of Rotary, the Five Avenues of Service are Rotary's philosophical cornerstone and the foundation on which club activity is based:

- Club Service focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the effective functioning of the Club.
- Vocational Service encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards.
- Community Service covers the projects and activities the Club undertakes to improve life in its community.
- International Service encompasses actions taken to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and to promote world understanding and peace.
- New Generations Service recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities, service projects, and exchange programs.

Obligations of Service

Rotary is an organization of members, committed to service:

- To participate in Rotary projects.
- To serve willingly on one or more committees.
- To attend Rotary District meetings such as

Assemblies, Conferences, Seminars, etc., if at all possible.

Attendance

Fun and fellowship are the hallmarks of the Flagler Beach meetings. All members are encouraged to attend weekly. In the event you cannot attend a meeting, a makeup meeting can be attended at any Rotary club in the local area and the world at large. Flagler Beach expects 50% attendance at a minimum.

Current Service Projects and Fundraisers, The Rotary Club of Flagler Beach

Project Share our major project supports members of the Pierson area migrant community with food and nutrition needs, clothing, a Christmas experience, and MORE.

Bunnell Sports Fields we have historically helped the area in and around Bunnell enhancing their recreational opportunities.

Other Projects As They Present Themselves a recently concluded project that placed mailboxes in an area of Bunnell underserved by the USPS for many years.

Rotary Cycle Flagler A major bicycle event hosted annually, of 25, 65 and 100 miles.

First Fridays In Flagler Beach Join us as we have fun and raise funds the first Friday of every month at the First Friday event of Flagler Beach

Polio Eradication – Rotary has played a lead role in the world wide eradication of Polio and continues to do so. In conjunction with the World Health Organization and in partnership with the Gates Foundation, it is a major emphasis of Flagler Beach and Rotary International.

Youth Initiatives Interact Club(Rotary's outreach to high school students; Early Act Club (Rotary's outreach to grade school students); RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, a 3 day event held annually at UNF and we sponsor an attendee; Rotary Youth Exchange, from time to time we host an exchange student; Scholarships, on a yearly basis we use some of our funds to support students in need to advance their education. **AND MORE...**
