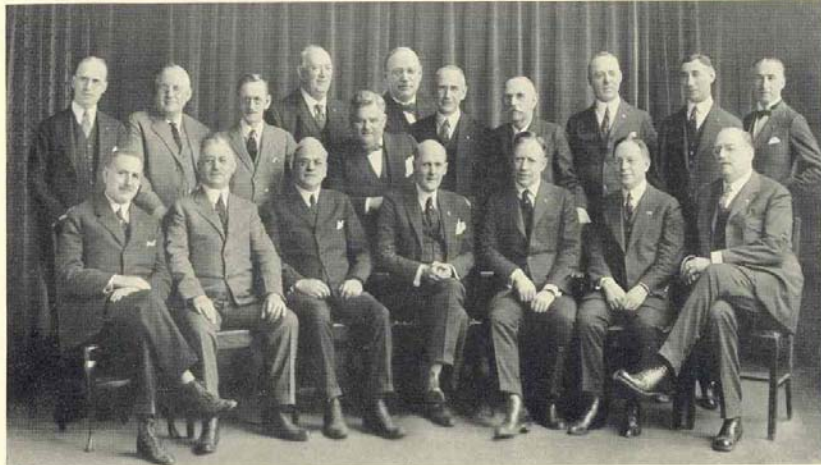


Take Me Out To the Ole Ballgame

Paul Harris (founding member), was a Chicago, Illinois, attorney Founder of Rotary International in 1905 and its first President.

Gustavus Loehr (founding member), a promoter, Gus' membership was of brief duration. The feverish ups and downs of business resulted first in his resignation from membership, and a few years later in his death.

Hiram Shorey (founding member), a merchant tailor who hailed from the state of Maine, due to circumstances beyond his control, did not retain his membership in the club.

Silvester Schiele (founding member), a coal dealer, **the first Rotary Club of Chicago president**, he was of German parentage

Harry Ruggles (member number five and Rotary's **1st Singer**), being a printer he **created the first printed emblem**. Since they called themselves "Rotary", Harry used a wagon wheel to Rotary Club above it. Also the sixth meeting took place at Harry's printing shop.

William Jenson (member number six), was the real estate business. He was the **first Rotary Club of Chicago secretary**.

A. L. White (early member), manufacturer of folding organs, He was the **second Rotary Club of Chicago president**.

Rufus F. Chapin (member in first year) was a banker. He was the **first Treasurer of Rotary International**, a position he held for a quarter of a century.

Bernard E. Arntzen (member in first year) was an undertaker

Fred H. Tweed (member in first year)

Ches Perry (member in after two years and eleven months) was from the Chicago Library system was the **first the General Secretary of what became "Rotary International."**
