Our Luncheon November 4th

Last Tuesday, were were blessed with guests **Evan Coope**r and **Fred Chen,** who are starting a yogurt business named "Yaourt Vietnamien." Yum, yum!

Matt Nocente, a third grade teacher, gave a very good explanation of why our Dictionary Project is still important.

Our guest speaker was **Laurie Savage**, from the dairy industry. She lives on a dairy farm near Dickerson, MD. A hundred milk cows can't sustain a family these days, so she also works as Secretary and Treasuer for the MD Dairy Association and the MD Holstein Association. Her county, Frederick, leads the state in whole milk production.

Laurie said the number of dairy farms in Maryland had gone down from more than 700 to just 400 in the past few years, as per capita consumption and the price of milk have decreased. Consumption of cheese, has increased up, and more than 15% of our milk supply goes into products that are exported.



She pointed out that milk was a bargain at 21 cents a cup. It isn't worthwhile buying an organic product, she said, because no milk in this area contains antibiotics. all milk has hormones, and the presence of genetically modified organisms in feed is nothing new.

Laurie said that dairy farmers care for the environment in several ways and that every farmer in the state most develop a nutrient management plan.

In sum, according to our speaker, drinking "moo juice" is good for consumers, the farmers, the economy and the environment.

Our meeting moved quickly to **Happy Dollars**, of which there were Many: from Winfree for his trip south and our speaker, from Tom for Matt, from Ken for free and fair elections, from Georges for a party organized by Marriott Hotels, from John and Ed for the speaker, from Ed because he didn't get fined for a ringing phone, and from Linda for all sorts of things.
