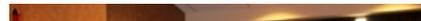
In her Junior year, Ms. Lum was a volunteer at Shady Grove Hospital and later at intern at the National Cancer Institute and George Washington University. These experiences, and her father's death from cancer, drove her toward a career in bio-medical research so she can help people to survive diseases and stay well.

In addition she took several Advanced Placement courses, had a GPA of 3.96 or 4.5, depending on how it is measured, and is on track to be a National AP Scholar.

We all were delighted to hear her speak.
