DG FRANK LAUNCHES THE GOVERNOR'S CLUB

DG Frank is passionate about the Foundation—he is passionate about what we together can do with the monies that return to the District in three years as District Designated Funds, DDF.

Currently, we have donated \$169,000 to the Foundation. If we continue to give at this level, we will have donated \$340,000 by the end of the Rotary year. In 2015-16, we will receive \$112,000 as DDF.

The Rotary Foundation along with Governor Frank and DGN-D Billi encourage each Rotarian in our district to give at least \$100. That would make us an all Sustaining Member District. We have many members that reach this level and a few clubs that consistently reach this level of giving. This year the *Rotary Clubs of Valdese, Pisgah Forest, Blowing Rock, Boone-Sunrise, Granite Falls, and Hickory-Sunrise* were 100% sustaining clubs. This means EVERYONE in their club gave \$100 personally.

I hope you have heard of the Paul Harris Society. These are folks who have committed to donate \$1,000 each year.

Governor Frank noticed that there is a large gap between a sustaining member (\$100 a year) and a Paul Harris Society member (\$1,000 a year), so he has inaugurated the Governor's Club. Folks who join this club pledge to give \$100 a quarter. I am sure there are many of you that can reach this level.

The Rotary Club of Asheville –Biltmore has two charter members of the Governor's Club of District 7670; president Heather Whitmire and John Veach. Congratulations!

WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

How many of you read Rotary publications, newsletters and emails and wonder... What the heck does that mean?

Here is a short primer to help.

TRF—The Rotary Foundation

SHARE—Funds for Foundation activities are distributed worldwide through the *SHARE* system. This system transforms contributions to

The Rotary Foundation into Ambassadorial Scholarships, Matching Grants, District Simplified Grants, global grants, and more.

At the end of each Rotary year, 50 percent of each district's contributions to the Annual Fund -- *SHARE* is credited to their District Designated Fund (DDF); the other 50 percent is credited to the World Fund.

World Fund—The Foundation uses the World Fund to pay for the worldwide programs available to all Rotary districts, regardless of their specific contributions. Districts use their DDF to pay for the Foundation activities they choose to participate in.

DDF—District Designated Funds—Funds returning to the District to be spent as we see fit. These



DSG—District Simplified Grants—Rotarians at Work

The following clubs have received district approval of their District Simplified Grant application this Rotary year:

Asheville – West, Avery County, Asheville Biltmore, Black Mountain, Blowing Rock, Boone, Boone Sunrise, Brevard, Burke Sunrise, Franklin, Franklin Daybreak, Hendersonville—Four Seasons, Highlands Mountaintop, Madison County, Morganton, Newton-Conover, Rutherford, Spruce Pine, Tryon, Valdese and Waynesville Sunrise. Asheville—South is in the approval process.

These grants use club money to match Foundation District Designated Funds. The projects must be completed and all paperwork must be in to Billi Black by April 1, 2013 to receive their matching money. All projects must be accompanied by pictures.

Clubs wishing to participate in similar grant projects next year under Future Vision, must have completed session 1 and 2 of the Future Vision Training AND have \$75 per capita giving this Rotary year to The Rotary Foundation. For more information contact DGN Gary Bray or PDG Ed Walcoff.

POLIO EFFORTS CONTINUE

Efforts to eradicate polio in the last three countries are ongoing. Now that India has been declared polio free, only Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria are left to tackle. Pakistan, however, is proving difficult. Aiming to thwart Pakistan's polio eradication efforts, militants have killed eight anti-polio medics and injured several others during the ongoing anti-polio campaign December 17-19.

The Pakistani government suspended its polio vaccination campaign in Karachi's Pashtun neighborhoods and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa December 19 after militants killed eight medics. Both the Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan and Jundullah have claimed responsibility for the attacks in Karachi and Peshawar. Both militant groups have vowed to bar vaccination teams from tribal regions of Pakistan. They claim the immunizations are un-Islamic and are a Western plot to sterilize Pakistani children. The Pakistani government and about 3,000 clerics have decried those claims and continue to push the immunization campaign.

Members of the All Pakistan Lady Health Workers Welfare Association demonstrated in Islamabad December 19 against the killing of anti-polio workers. Eight anti-polio workers were killed by militants in different parts of Pakistan. Pakistani President Asif Ali Zardari December 18 condemned the slayings and directed the chief secretaries of Sindh and KP to investigate the incidents and submit their reports immediately.

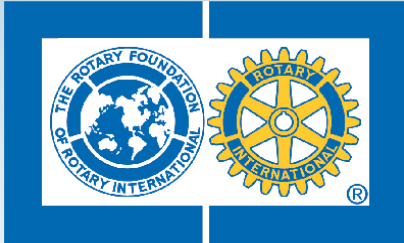
DG Frank is looking for \$40 in quarters from each Rotarian to help fight polio! Have you donated your quarters?

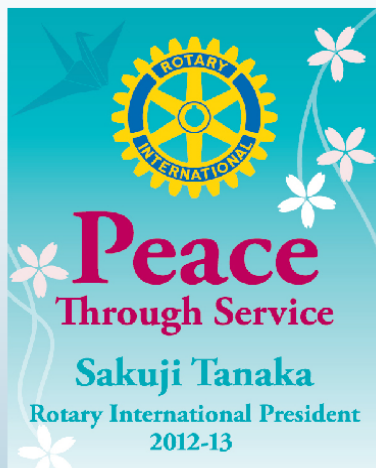

Matching Grant!

The Rotary Club of Hendersonville under the supervision of Florence Allbaugh has submitted a Matching Grant for our District for \$50,500. Florence is working with the Rotary Club of Makati West in District 3830 in the Philippines. This mission will serve 10-12 Filipino children with heart issues AND will train Filipino doctors.

This medical training mission will enable the Filipino pediatric cardiac team to continue with their training and improve their skills. During each training mission, the entire cardiac team (including screening, Operating Theatre team and ICU team) are trained in a particular cardiac malady. The level of training is increased as the Filipino medical team shows that they are ready for the

next level.

According to the Department of Health, congenital heart disease (CHD) is one of the leading health concerns in the Philippines. The leading cause of mortality in the 5 year study is heart disease with 83,081 cases occurring at a rate of 95.5/year. Establishing and supporting the development of a sustainable program at Philippine Children's Medical Center is the ONLY WAY to respond to this large, unmet need to reduce the childhood mortality with proven invasive surgical intervention. With enhanced skills as a result of this training visit, the Filipino pediatric cardiac team will be able to continue operating on Filipino children even after the visiting team has left.

funds represent 1/2 of the funds sent to The Rotary Foundation three years prior to the funding. For example, if we donate \$340,000 this year to SHARE at The Rotary Foundation, in 2015-2016, we will have \$170,000 to use in our District to match Global and District Grants, to use for Scholarships or to fund a GSE or VTT.
