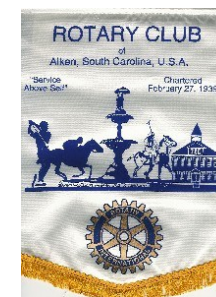

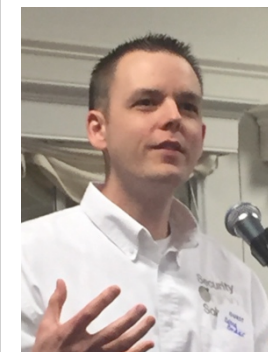

Mr. Doug Berks, CEO of Security Onion in Augusta spoke to the club about cyber security and provided tips to avoid being hacked. Mr. Berks began his company in 2008 and offers a software program along with training that is designed to foil cyber identity theft and intellectual property thieves.

He offered an example of how devastating cyber theft can be by using SRS as an example with its physical security, which provides an effective shield against physical invasion and theft. However, he stated, from a cyber point of view the SRS computer system connected to the Internet can be invaded in milliseconds with devastating effect. Such thieves can be government sponsored and come from China and/or Russia. He also illustrated how major corporations can be vulnerable by citing the relatively recent attacks on Sony Corporation, which was hacked on multiple occasions.
