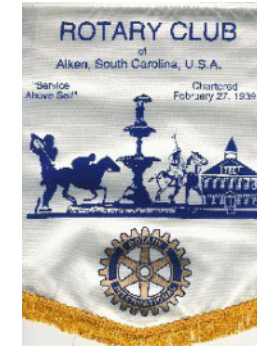

Brent Hoover, this past week's speaker was introduced by one of his former teachers, Rotarian Sanela Porca-Konjikusic. Brent's resume is varied and extensive. He is the owner of Hoover Studios, a South Carolina Small Business Development Consultant, a lecturer at USC School of Business Administration and former fiscal intern with Savannah River Nuclear Solutions. He earned an MBA from The University of North Carolina at Greensboro, his undergraduate degree in Management from USC Aiken and is a proud product of South Aiken High School. Brent was here to speak to our club about Enatus at USC-Aiken. EN-ACT-US taken from Entrepreneurial- Action-Us, is a community of student, academic and

business leaders committed to using the power of entrepreneurial action to transform lives and shape a better more sustainable world. It is currently in 36 countries, 1,730+ Universities, involving 72,000+ students and has so far impacted 1,300,000+ people world wide. This program is in its infancy at USC-Aiken. At just one month old, there are currently 5 students involved. They have formed to determine how they can best help local non-profits stay in business, be sustainable and better help the local community. Currently they are at work with Carla Cloud and ACTS (Area Churches Together Serving) in Aiken and ACTS 2 in Graniteville. ENACTUS believes investing in students who take entrepreneurial action for others creates a better world for us all. I feel these ideals are very much inline with Rotary's "Service Above Self". Brent Hoover appears to be a young man who can guide these college students toward making a substantial impact in the Aiken area and beyond.
