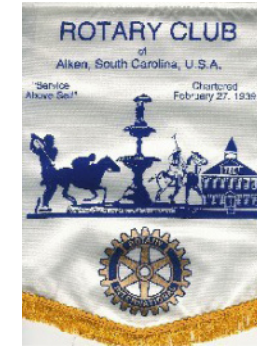

### PROGRAM LAST WEEK by Mallory Holley



Todd Coleman, the Director of the Law Enforcement Technology Support Center at the Savannah River Nuclear Lab, spoke to our club on Monday, November 13th. The Law Enforcement Technology Support Center is funded by the Department of Justice and provides analytical and technical support to the FBI and other local agencies. Most of Todd's presentation focused on his time in New York City after the terrorist attack on September 11, 2001. The Department of Justice called Todd and his team 30 minutes after the second plane struck the South tower asking what they had to help search. Two days later, the team from SRNL was escorted by local and state police officers up to New York, where they would spend the next three weeks. Once on the scene, they were stationed

in the Merrill Lynch building. Due to the destruction, the SRNL team was instructed to create a drop camera. The drop camera was to be used to look for life down in holes. The camera was a 360 degree articulating camera with a microphone to detect survivors. The team also built the infrared and recording "Riley Cam." The "Riley Cam" was built for cadaver dogs. It attached to a tear away collar to make sure the cadaver dog could free itself if the collar were to catch on something. Finally, the team was instructed to install a network camera system to record the crime scene at all times. The difficulty of installing cameras came from the lack of safe buildings around Ground Zero. Todd's team researched and determined the best possible locations and installed all of the HD cameras safely. The Law Enforcement Technology Support Center has also provided services the 2013 Space Shuttle Columbia Crash as well as Hurricane Harvey/Irma Technical Assistance. Once again, we learned that the people of Aiken County are impacting our country and our world.
