*(Get Paul Harris Fellow credit)*

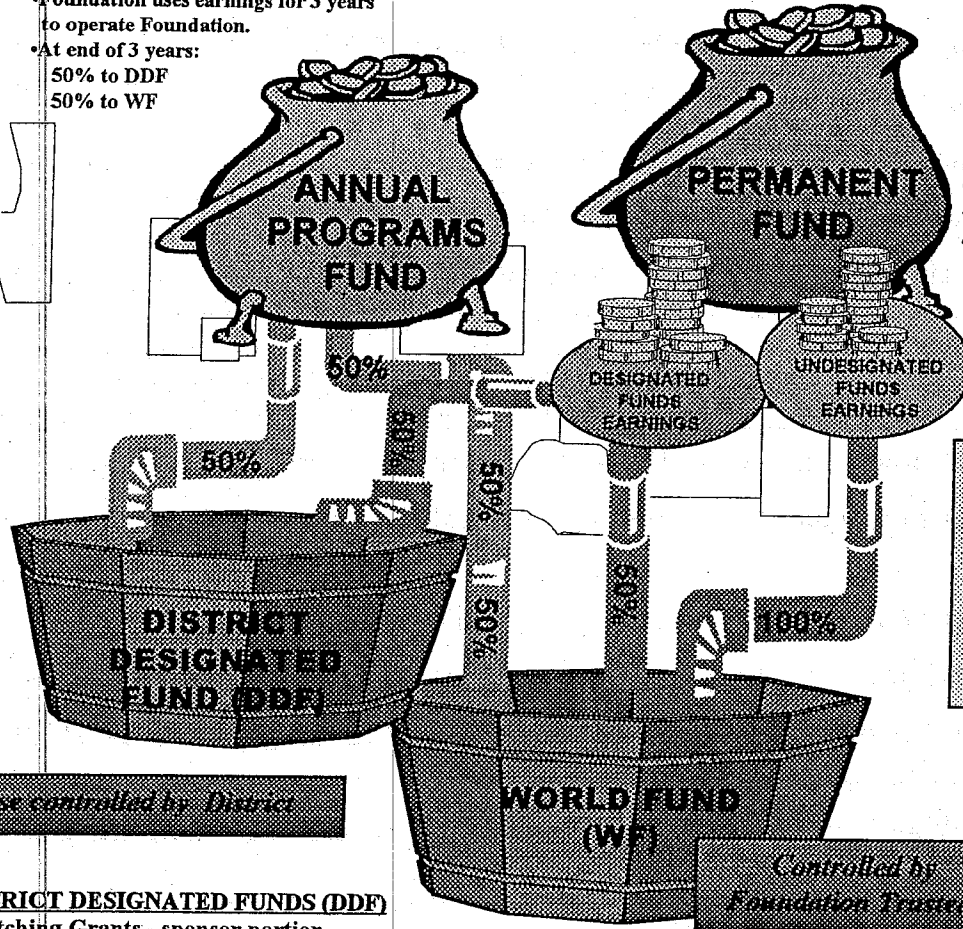
- Unrestricted gifts
- Foundation uses earnings for 3 years to operate Foundation.
- At end of 3 years:
  - 50% to DDF
  - 50% to WF

## Permanent Fund

*Benefactor credit.*

*(Do not get Paul Harris Fellow credit.)*

- Only EARNINGS are spent.
- Target of \$1 Billion by 2025
- Irrevocable Life Insurance Gifts
- Contributions
- 50% of permanent fund earnings are credited to the DDF **only** if requested at the time the donation is made.
