


President Kathy presented Carol Howell with a plaque in honor of the contributions of Bent Creek Vinery to the club during Past President Sam's term.

• Joel Swanson thanked club members for volunteering for the Back to School Ice Cream Social at Marylin Avenue School: details to follow.





Board of Trustees at UC Merced.

The Commission for the Arts is one of the City Council's advisory bodies. It was established in 2004 to develop Livermore's ArtsALIVE Cultural Arts Plan and establish a public arts grants program which is funded by developers at the rate of 0.03% of project cost. The wine country mural next to Strizzi's was the first public art piece approved by Commission.

Monya shared that public artart which can be enjoyed by everyone free of charge - is a symbol of a vibrant community and discussed the commission's activities:

- Reviewing and approving grant requests many having a youth emphasis.
- Presenting graduating seniors with art awards.

- Selecting the Poet Laureate, the current one is Cynthia Patton. Poetry events including Open Mic at Carnegie. Park Rotary Bandstand.
- Approving public art funded by others such as the Wheels Bus shelters.
- Approving the Arroyo bike trail beautification project which helps deter graffiti.
- Selecting the 4 sculptures recently installed along First Street in Downtown from 160 + responses, 3 of the 4 are kinetic sculptures. Artists selected were from throughout the country.



• Selecting the sculpture for Stockmen's Park – a heroic sized (8-foot-tall) 1918 cowboy going off to war, trading his cowboy hat for army helmet. Guest Vice-Mayor Bob Woerner shared that a sculpture was included

Monya encouraged club members to view map of public art in Livermore on the City website under Things to Do and invited member to attend a future commission meeting. She also announced that there are two openings on the commission. Beth Wilson added that LARPD also selects commissioners, so people interesting in applying can apply through that route as well.



In discussion the budget for public art, Monya noted that since funding comes from developer public art fees, it varies greatly year-to-year. Additionally, some developers are incorporating public art into their own developments instead of paying into the public art fund.
