## Oregon Fun Facts - Did You Know?

Oregon's state flag is the only state flag in the United States to have different designs on each side – the escutcheon from the state seal on the obverse and a gold figure of a beaver on the reverse side.

Portland, Oregon has more breweries than any other city in the world. Within its city limits, Portland has more than 60 breweries.

Crater Lake is the deepest in the U.S. and was actually pooled in the remains of a volcano. The deepest lake in the United States, Crater Lake, was formed more than 6,500 years ago within the remains of an ancient volcano. The crystal-blue waters of Crater Lake are known worldwide.

Mill Ends Park The park is a small circle 2 ft across, with a total area of 452 sq in (0.292 m). Mill Ends Park was designated as a city park in 1948. It is the smallest park in the world, according to the *Guinness Book of Records*, which first granted it this recognition in 1971.

In 1971 Oregon became the first state to ban the use of non-returnable bottles and cans. *The law is credited with reducing litter and increasing container recycling. As a result, items which used to make up around 40% of roadside litter now represent about 6%.*

Eugene was the first city to have one-way streets, and is quoted by "Bicycling Magazine" as one of the top ten cycling communities in the United States.

Oregon residents own one-fourth of the country's total llama population.
