Disneyland!

In mid-December of this year I had the opportunity to celebrate an extended family event at Disneyland. There were 12 of us that that made the trip from Oregon to Orange County and all of us had a fantastic, if not exhausting, time. My wife and children love the "magic" of Walt Disney and who can blame them? Disney has done a wonderful job of creating a safe, family-rich, environment that literally any age can enjoy.

As I walked through Disneyland and California Adventure, I could not help to think of the massive mechanism that has to keep this juggernaut moving forward. Disney has reported in the past that that approximately a third of its \$45 billion (with a B) in annual revenue comes from is theme parks and approximately \$11 billion of is operating profit. With all of the parks combined, Disney will host approximately 135 million guests in a year and all of those guests buying mouse ears, key chains, churros, beer, wine, corn dogs and much more. In fact, I saw a store on Disney's Main Street that was selling art and collectibles for as much as \$20,000. Capitalism is a wonderful thing.

But again, how do you feed, park, transport and entertain an average 44,000 people a day in a space of approximately 85 acres? Disney purports that each year 3 million hamburgers are sold, 6.5 million portions of French fries and 2.8 million churros are sold. Disney's Grand Californian Hotel alone holds some 16,000 bottles of wine in its cellar. There is a little known parking structure on campus that can accommodate more than 10,000 vehicles and this doesn't include the multitude of off-site shuttle parking lots.

In reality, Disneyland and California Adventure are basically a pretty sizeable city. Like any City, there needs to be security, a sewer system, a medical alert and care practice and places to eat and sleep. All of this **AND** an attempt to make it the Happiest Place on Earth. A tall order for any city, I would suppose.
